2. Global Politics
Concept of global politics. Different political systems. Interaction between domestic and foreign policy.
3. International Law
Foundations of international law. International treaties and agreements. Role of international courts.
Second Semester
1. International Organizations
Role of the United Nations and regional organizations. Non-governmental organizations and their impact on international relations. Globalization and its impact on international organizations.
2. International Political Economy
Basics of international economics. Global trade and investment. Global economic crises and management.
3. Human Rights in International Relations
Evolution of the concept of human rights. International human rights treaties. Role of international organizations in protecting human rights
Third Semester
1. International Security
Concepts of national and international security. Contemporary security challenges (terrorism, transnational crime, civil wars). National and international security strategies.
2. International Conflict and Resolution
Causes of international conflicts. Tools and methods for conflict resolution. Case studies of international conflicts and resolutions.
3. Diplomacy and Negotiation
Principles of diplomacy. Negotiation techniques in international relations. Practical case studies in diplomatic negotiation.

2. Media and International Relations

Role of media in international relations.
